Its also important to realise your dog may act differently towards other dogs when they are <u>on lead</u>. Some dogs can feel restricted and and if they are forced to interact or aren't given space they can become uncomfortable and can even react.

Ultimately, having a good understanding and respect for your dogs body language will keep your dog safe, and others too.
